The Booking Agent will send you booking information and a deposit is required within 14 days to confirm your booking.

Upon receipt of deposit, you will receive further details about the camp including arrangements for obtaining camp keys. The deposit will be deducted from the camp fee if you leave the site clean, equipment is returned to storage place in good dry repair and the camp is securely locked.

Crests may be purchased on the honour system. They will be stored in the Kirby Panabode. Payment of \$3.00 each to be included with camp rental payment.

CAMP JUBILEE is located in Southern Vancouver Island Area approximately 60 km and a 70 minute drive from Victoria. 10 acres of the 160 acre forested property is developed for camp use.

Two foot bridges cross salmon-bearing Kirby Creek (a.k.a. Coal Creek) to access two of the camping sites. Kirby Creek was named after the Kirby family who farmed there in the early 1900's. Signage describes the 2009 fish habitat improvement project at the camp.

A small rustic Chapel in the woods, for use by all campers, is just a few minutes up the trail past "KIRBY" site.

A neighbour generously permits Girl Guides access to the seashore through their property with prior arrangement. It is a 900 meter walk down the driveway.

The Shirley Community Hall & Pioneer Park is a 900 meter walk up the hill.

DIRECTIONS TO CAMP: If heading from Victoria, travel ~17.5 km past the centre of Sooke. Turn right into the gated camp driveway just before Kirby Creek Bridge. French Beach Provincial Park is ~4 km farther along on West Coast Road (a 55 minute walk).

CAMP PROCEDURES

Fires are permitted in wood-stoves, designated fire-pits and on rocky creek bed, unless there is a Provincial fire ban in this "Coastal" area. Creek-side fires must be completely dismantled after use.

Equipment provided: Vitex tents (Kirby only), patrol boxes (cooking pots/utensils, dish bowls), water buckets, fire buckets, firewood and fire extinguishers for kitchen area.

Wheelbarrows & carts stored in Panabode may be used to move gear.

Potable water is available from a large tank in the parking lot. Take home all garbage & recycling.

Campers must bring: food, stoves, lanterns, fuel, First Aid supplies, TP, cleaning supplies, containers for leftovers, personal dishes/cutlery, and nylon tents (if not using vitex tents provided)..

The camp is primarily undeveloped forest.

Keep a clean campsite. Food should be stored in secure containers and put in vehicles or buildings on site overnight to avoid attracting infrequent shy bears.

The first group to arrive must pick up the **phone**, stored in KIRBY panabode, and install it at the utility pole near the parking lot outhouses. The phone is for *emergency* use for ALL camp sites.



BRIDGES SITE

- Cross two footbridges to access site
- Two large dining shelters with counters & picnic tables; one is wheelchair accessible and has wood-stove
- Large field for activities & pitching tents



"BRIDGES" & "KIRBY" sites have:

Fire pits with fireside benches available (stored in shelters). Panabode for equipment storage; with woodstove; not for sleeping in; good for warming up; no food consumption inside

- Flag pole
- 4-hole outhouse
- LDU (Liquid disposal pit for grey water)

KIRBY SITE



- Cross one bridge from parking lot to access site
- One large, wheelchair accessible dining shelter with woodstove & permanent tables. Benches stored inside.



- Four 9'x12' Vitex tents with 4' side-walls & flies, on wood platforms; one is wheelchair accessible although terrain might be a challenge.
- Pitch additional tents in field area if required.

GATEWAY SITE

- Small dining shelter with wood stove
- Fire-pit •LDU
- Outhouse nearby
- Often booked by small groups or as additional space for large camps.
